Regular Children's Activities

Our regular children's programs are held each week at Alstonville, Ballina and Lennox Head libraries and there is no need to book. There are three different programs to choose from, depending on the age of your child:

Baby Bounce: This is a 20 to 30 minute session aimed at babies aged from zero to twelve months. Each session involves parents sitting in a circle and holding their babies as they sing a variety of nursery rhymes, clap hands, and follow the session leader through a series of guided movements. There are also fun games involving plastic balls, musical instruments and other props.

Toddler Time: This is similar to Baby Bounce but is aimed at children aged from twelve months to two years. Guided by a staff member, parents and children sit in a circle and sing nursery rhymes with an emphasis on activity songs involving specific movements and hand gestures.

Storytime: Aimed at children from two to five years of age, Storytime involves a staff member reading two or three stories to the children, as well as leading the group through three or four nursery rhymes or action songs. This is followed by a simple craft activity in which the children, with help from their parent construct a pre-designed craft object using the materials supplied. Stories, songs and craft are typically based on a specific theme which varies from week to week. These sessions run from 45 minutes to an hour.
